
Additional Food Storage



In coordination with the State of Iowa and the Iowa Department of Human Services four million dollars in funds was available for COVID-19 health emergency activities to food bank partner agencies and programs. Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have worked hard to help individuals and families with the resources they need to help them with the hardships they faced. For thousands of individuals that meant needing help to put food on the table for themselves and their loved ones. Since the pandemic began in March 2020, we have helped 4,291 individuals through our five-day a week food bank, known as the George J. Williams Memorial Food Bank. In addition to this need and the generosity of the community, we needed additional capacity to store food. The freezers we had before were in disrepair and did not allow for adequate storage space. This is why we were so grateful to be the recipients of these grant dollars to purchase two new freezers and a refrigerator. Having this refrigerator has helped us to provide even more healthy items to those we serve. Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program Starting Soon

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, also know as LIHEAP, will officially begin on October 1 for households with members who are elderly or disabled. Recently, we have begun sending out automatic eligibility letters to households who were approved last year and

meet certain criteria. We would like to request that anyone who received one of these letters return them as soon as possible so we can begin to process your application for this year.
