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For Hali Davies, life was not always easy. For years she struggled with addiction, homelessness and little to no support. That all changed two years ago when she began her recovery journey, and her life turned around for the better. Through the PROMISE JOBS program she was referred to our Family Development and Self-Sufficiency (FaDSS) program. "Not only did this program add an extra layer of support for my family, but it has helped my life come full circle," said Davies. "My worker has so much knowledge about various resources.

Today, Davies is enrolled in classes at Western Iowa Tech Community College, where she will be graduating with her first degree in May. Davies' FaDSS worker has also helped her with other resources for both her and her son. "It seems like any road block I came to, my worker either knew a way to help me or knew someone she could ask," Davies said.

The FaDSS program has been administered by us since 1990. Through this program, hundreds of families have been successful, just like Hali. They have become self-sufficient and built

stronger relationships with their loved ones. In July, the number of families we are able to serve was increased from 41 families to 63. This just means we can help more people and fulfil our mission of "Helping People. Changing Lives."

There is only one month left before the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) ends. Since October 1, we have helped more than 450 households with their heating costs. This program is income-based. To qualify, families must live in Woodbury County and be at or below 200% of the federal poverty guideline.
